



Prepare Your RV

1 Staging your RV

The main goal of the video is to help potential guests imagine what it's like to stay in your RV.

Make sure to showcase your RV at its finest with staging and extra flair. Add some flowers to the table, cozy blankets to the bed and set up chairs or lights outside – whatever RVezy guests might expect to experience during their stay!

Make sure to highlight what makes your RV special – speak to unique amenities you offer!

2 Highlight key areas

- Sleeping Areas: Demonstrate the comfort and space of the sleeping quarters.
- **Bathroom and Shower**: Highlight the cleanliness and functionality of the bathroom.
- Kitchen and Dinette: Tour the kitchen area including the dinette set-up.
- Living Area: Focus on the living area's comfort and versatility.
- Additional Amenities: Don't forget to showcase extra amenities that set your RV apart!

3 Surrounding site clean up

We recommend trying to do your video at an on-site location (i.e., campsite upon delivery, while on a trip) to be able to best capture the experience RVezy guests might expect to enjoy!

Wherever you choose to do your video, make sure to **remove all surrounding clutter or unnecessary items** to make your site look clean and organized.

4 Lighting

Try to film during the day when you can take advantage of natural light. Open all curtains and shades to brighten the interior.

Do a quick lighting test to make sure that your RV is well lit! Don't forget to turn the lights on if necessary.

Avoid back lighting and be careful not to film against bright windows, which can throw off the exposure and obscure interior details.

5 Weather

Film your video on a day with **blue skies** and sunshine to make your RV warm and inviting.

Avoid shooting in bad weather so you can showcase your RV in the best light!

6 Things to avoid

 Prominent footage of beer, wine or alcohol

Brands logos as focal points
Poor lighting









Best Practices

- 1 Keep your video short, anywhere between 30 seconds to 1 minute.
- **Use a smartphone**, such as an iPhone or Android.
- **Shoot horizontally** (1920 x 1080) and in 4K or HD.
- No audio, voice over or music needed let your RV be the star of the show!


- Steady shots use a gimbal or stabilizer to keep your camera steady while moving around. In all cases avoid shaky footage as it can be distracting.
- Smooth transitions walk slowly and steadily from one area of the RV to another to create a natural flow in the space.
- Plan what you want to film and do a few test runs.


1 Ideal Settings for iOS:
